## A Little Child

Head hanging and heart pounding I willed my aching feet to take another step. Thin air and exertion had long since been my constant assailants. My shirt, now five days old, and trousers of a week were drenched with salt soaked sweat, and as tortured lungs gasped for my next breath, my spirits began to sink.

I did the unforgivable. I raised my gaze to see the rock strewn path ahead. There is a nerve that runs from the eye to the back of the leg. Every trekker knows about this nerve and the really accomplished human gazelles never lift their gaze from the path. When you want to see the scenery, you pull over, lean on a tree or rock and rest the equipment while you enjoy the view. But you never look up while walking. The nerve sent a shock through my ham strings and the motor stopped. I was finished.

Grey clouds of despair cast whispering shadows through my fatigued mind. “You are never going to get out of these mountains.” One shadow built on another.

“You have left a wonderful wife and two blessed boys to come out here and die on these rocks.” The second voice joined in demonic harmony.

“If you die now, your children won’t even find out until you have been cremated. Your life will have been a total waste.” The trio whispered their anthem of despair.

“You think you have been called by God? You made it up. And now you are out here on the edge of the world with no purpose. You haven’t any money, your bills are not paid. Your children will never go on to be anything, they will turn against the message you carry and your life will have been a complete waste.” Now a pounding rhythm and negative thought flooded my mind. I stopped.

The rock looked very comfortable. It was just large enough to rest against and, slipping the straps of my backpack away from my weary shoulders, I just sat there. The famous climb to the southern ridge of the Annapurna Sanctuary had sapped another would-be trekker of all he had to give. Nepal and the Hymal had won again. What had I been thinking to say “yes” to this insane trip?

Was it glory? To be able to say I had done it? If so, it would be the most foolish decision I had ever made; because out here in the mountains – always behind, so very out of condition, always working through the negative cloud – there was no one to impress.

Wow...this recent trip was absolutely fantastic! I could tell you about it for weeks and still never tell you about all of the great things that are happening. Here are some highlights:

- Friends Around the Table was a wonderful time of fellowship and learning. Through the anointed teachings of Pastor Gary Ham, the Lord encouraged us to continue to provide a heritage in Jesus for the generations to come.
- Kid's Camp was a very high energy event (which could be expected with over 250 children). The kids had a lot of fun worshipping the Lord and playing at the beach. Over 90 were baptized on the last day.
- The Rongko Teacher's Retreat showed me the unity in the teachers at Rongko school. They behave like family. The Lord is moving within them in a great way and is affecting the entire community through them. On their last day, they were baptized. They were so joyful, that they played in the water.

As I was praying about what to share with you, the Lord told me to show you a certain family of five children. Last October, four of them came to NHO, the first family from Boeurn's home village. The 5<sup>th</sup> child, the oldest brother, was found in April and brought to NHO. One year ago, you could see the hopelessness in their faces. Please compare their initial photo and the one I just took. You can see the difference that Jesus has made in their lives.

## Prayer Testimony

They sat at the far end of the room. Faces fixed in focused fascination as we shared the vision for a new Cambodia. These were four elementary school principals who had been invited to the first annual teachers retreat of our staff from the Rongko School. They were Buddhists. In Thailand, Lord Buddha means national loyalty and devotion to the King. In Tibet, it means a tolerance of other faiths. In Cambodia, it is the National Religion as defined in the constitution. To these four it means there is no other religion that is recognized by their government.

Pastor Ken Cramer, our guest speaker for the retreat, was sharing seven events in the life of Christ. His presentation was simple and straightforward so that the translators would have no difficulty. The four sat transfixed at the telling of the testimony of Jesus. I watched and prayer flowed straight from my heart to the Lord, "It is your will that they receive and be saved."

Their faces remained fixed, a study in stone. After each message they gathered at the coffee area and discussed all that Ken had said. They were listening. They had heard from our principal that Jesus is the only answer for the nations. They had come to find out how the changes they had seen in his school were possible. Thursday came and Ken left. It was my opportunity. The Lord prompted me to speak on "Identification" as it relates to water baptism in the Christian experience, how we must believe and be baptized. Again their faces were stone. All the while my heart and those of our believers cried out to the Lord. "Tomorrow morning," I heard myself declare, "we will baptize all who desire to follow the Lord Jesus." There it was, right out there in very confrontational terms.

They talked. They asked questions. Pastor Sinai answered every question and at 11 Friday morning, they followed their new Lord, Jesus, in water baptism. "Ask of me and I will give you the nations." This bold statement found in Psalm 2 has been the rock solid foundation for our prayers. Now we must follow through in four new schools to reach all the children and their families. Please pray for Cambodia.

Have you ever struggled with your faith in Him? Have you ever doubted His Faithfulness to you?

I'm writing this as October looms near and you will be reading this in October itself. As I write this, we are in a middle of a tainted milk formula crisis here in China. Our families in Tibet are not spared. The Number 1 People's Hospital has opened a separate wing to serve the families that are filling the corridors to have the children checked. The staff are over-stretched, doing extra shifts in order to make sure that every child is seen to and cared for. Local staff working with SEAPC have been called in to help. All this is happening while the SEAPC website proclaims:

"On October 6, SEAPC TOUCHING HEARTS will make the trek into the Himalayas again with medical doctors from around the globe to find more children needing treatment for congenital heart defects. This team, led by Dr. Brad Keller of Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh and funded in partnership with Variety Children's Lifeline, will be focused on screening children from the remote regions of Southern Tibet and treating the list of nearly 35 children now awaiting procedure."

These foreign staff have taken time away

from work in their own countries with the goal of providing care for as many children as possible in Tibet. Dr. Keller is rightfully concerned that the local staff and I have yet to go to Shannan, southern Tibet to do preliminary groundwork. We hope to screen 2,000 children, but until now, we do not even have an idea of whether there is a suitable place there to hold the screening, let alone the number of children we can screen. Our screening is scheduled right after the October Chinese National Public Holidays. Everybody knows the first few days after a long break are usually slow days of work and this hampers needed progress. Yet, this is the only window open to us because of the preceding Olympics and coming winter. Why does it feel so bleak?

Yes, I am struggling with my faith in Him. But in October, when you are reading this, be sure to follow the updates. You will find them on our website, as well as social platforms like Facebook. Why not call us? Make the effort and find out for yourself how Great is God's faithfulness. I struggle, but I am also more than happy to testify.

As we travel the nations and see the people like sheep without a shepherd in a spiritual desert, dying spiritually and even physically, our hearts grieve and cry out for God to have mercy and send laborers to these fields. There is a church in Tuxtla Gutierrez where a dear friend of mine, Victor Hugo, pastors. This church has been experiencing a special visitation of the Holy Spirit for quite some time. The worship is awesome and miracles are happening. You can see the fire in the eyes of the children and the adults. I can picture these people in the spiritual desert, imparting life. I always shared with Pastor Victor Hugo about what the Lord is doing and the need for laborers among the nations. There was always a sense of excitement but he always gave the same answer "We are not ready yet."

Three years ago, he was diagnosed with a chronic pulmonary disease and, even in his condition, he continued pastoring this church. His church was doing well and growing, and every time we visited him or spoke with him over the phone, we prayed and believed God for a miracle. A couple months ago we visited his church. We prayed for him once again for healing and again, I spoke to him about the mission field. He just smiled. I kept hoping and praying and visualizing this church imparting life in the spiritual desert of the nations.

Recently, I called Victor Hugo and as he picked up the phone he started laughing. I asked him what was so funny and he told me that he was just thinking about me because he had some good news. He told me, "I am totally healed, God healed me!" He said that God is moving in his church in a stronger way than ever before. The first word that came to his mind when he thought about me was "teams." I asked him what he meant

Nepal went away, but the pounding head and heart sped on toward their break point.

His face was round and brown. Skin the color of the earth from which it had been formed, straight black hair and the deepest brown eyes I had ever seen wrinkled into a wide open smile.

He was fascinated by the hair on my arms and legs which he tugged with glee. A giggle and then a full laugh bubbled from his heart as he looked at my nose. But, when the eyes of this giant opened and they were blue as the sky, he called to his friends with glee.

They ran to join the adventure. They poked and prodded laughing at every turn. Despair followed fatigue through the exit of purpose.

In his face and eyes was the answer to every question trying to confirm reservations in the hotel of my head.

We laughed and played. I tried to rub the brown from his skin and he tried to rub the white from mine. We compared leg length and thickness. They marveled over every aspect

of my stature. I forgot fatigue and despair. Their eyes were the reason why, the answer to every question.

Lifting myself to one elbow, I became their couch and together we watched as a brown eagle taught her young to ride the currents of the air. Soaring together they lifted my heart to the heavens. The kids loved it. I loved it. And God loved it, as forgetting about myself I once again marveled at His glory.

Twenty-five years have passed. I see their faces in the thousands of children we now know in Asia. Skin of the earth, hair black as can be and those deep brown eyes have carried me through mountain and valley. They encourage me in times of need and caution me in times of abundance. They are the stabilizing tail on the soaring kite of my emotions.

We are still very happily married. The boys are through college and working in their chosen fields. We have no debt and have enjoyed God's faithfulness. We have just a few more mountains to climb and the way may not be easy, but I have heard the laughter of a child so deeply in my heart that I am certain the Lord will send a little child to lead me through every dark hour.

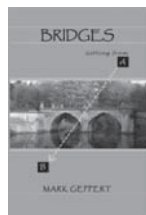

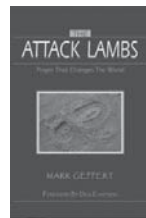

In the “New Season” much more is needed to accomplish the impossible. Yes, the numbers are larger, the goals are higher, the commitments are more challenging, and the schedules are nothing short of extreme.

The “New Season” for the Touching Hearts project in Tibet is defined in a three-year commitment signed in July. It asks the South East Asia Prayer Center to find 9,000 children throughout the Himalayan trenches and traverses who need life-saving care. It asks for 68 rural physicians to be trained medically. It asks for the development of six regional care centers and a program that provides vitamins and supplements to women of child bearing age. The cost is estimated at \$15 million over the next five years.

I heard a message, that I pray will never leave me, while sitting with several pastors in San Diego last month: “Your Strength lies in the Promises of God.”

When I’m feeling a bit under duress, when I can’t wait for the fourteen hour flight across the ocean and the free time it brings to catch up, and when the voices of impossibility are echoing through my emails — here is where I find my strength.

II Corinthians 1:18-22

The promises of Jesus Christ are YES and AMEN!

This month, Variety Children’s Lifeline, and Salah M. Hassanein have partnered again with

Touching Hearts to sponsor the screening and treatment team that will provide life-saving care to the children who need it in Tibet. Please pray for him and their team. We are grateful for their continued support and the way God has used this partnership to serve those in need.

## Kingdom First Financial

“Then God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb that yields seed, and the fruit tree that yields fruit according to it’s kind, whose seed is in itself, on the earth and it was so. And the earth brought forth grass, the herb that yeilds seed according to it’s kind, and the tree that yields fruit, who’s seed is in itself, on the earth and it was so.” Genesis 1:11

“While the earth remains seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, winter and summer, and day and night, shall not cease.” Genesis 8:22

Fall is my favorite time of the year. I always have loved the beauty that comes as summer gives way to harvest time. Harvest time is a time when all the manifestation from seeds that were planted in the springtime have grown and multiplied. I have taken a particular interest in zucchini plants. Each spring my wife will put in four or five zucchini plants because she loves to cook them so many different ways. She will dice them, slice them, fry them, grill them and bake them. Breads and cakes, casseroles and appetizers. She can make an entire meal out of one plant for months.

One day, in my time with the Lord, I began to look at this vegetable closely and began to think of how many zuchini’s come off of just one plant. We are usually looking to

pawn them off on freinds and relatives because we just can’t receive the full abundance that comes. I began to think that each zucchini has within itself hundreds of seeds, that if planted would produce hundreds of plants that would produce thousands of zuchinnis and the process would continue on forever. We have a stand down the road from our house that sells them for fifty cents each, my business calculations tell me on a normal year we could take these vegetables from these five small plants and sell in the city for twice that. We figure, in a season, if cared for properly, we probably get fifty plus zuchinni off each plant. Doing a projected business model for every three foot by 10 foot plot of ground we could generate approximately \$225 profit in a typical Ohio summer. We own two acres so... we could throw this principle with the right reinvestment strategy and solve the U.S. Economic crisis by teaching others this same principle.

We may laugh at this thought but that is the exact answer to all our economic and social issues that we face. As I began to meditate the Word on seed time harvest I found that it is a law and works every time. The next thing I would learn through my study and meditation was that this principle is the foundational principle in The Kingdom of God. Everything we say and do is a seed. The seeds we plant or sow will determine

the harvest we receive. In Galatians 6:7 the Word clearly states, “Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap.”

Words are seeds and Jesus said that it was the foundational operation principle of the Kingdom. Read Mark 4. These teachings and the application of the same would be the strategy that I have chosen to operate my businesses and have seen tremendous growth.

The Kingdom of God system works when we learn to work it the way he intended. Seed time harvest is the first step to see The Blessing come upon whatever we put our hands to. The Blessing was the first thing God ever spoke over man Genesis 1:27-28. It is time for for us to “be fruitful and multiply: fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth.”

It all starts with words.

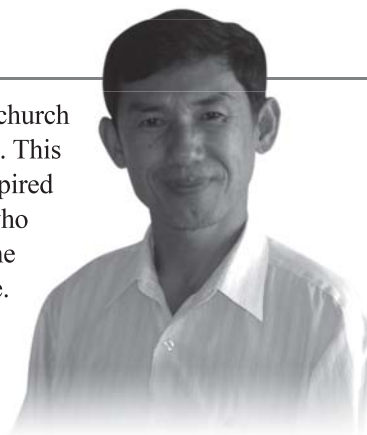

Last month, I asked for your prayers for our trip to Cambodia and especially our time with the teachers from the Rongko Public School that we have been partnering with, through the government of Cambodia. I hope you don't mind the extra pressure of being my trusted prayer support for this project. Your prayers for the trip were answered with the water baptism of each of the 46 teachers attending plus four principles of other schools who were invited to come by the school superintendent. He was the first convert in the project and has worked very hard to see the gospel advance. Pastor Ken Cramer's (Lighthouse Worship Center AOG at Hayes, VA) teaching on the basics of Jesus was a perfect lead into water baptism. Thank you Pastor Ken.

The superintendent was also baptized in water with his lovely wife. Mr. Hou Bun Heng is so on fire for the Lord and attended our Friends Around the Table the first week we were there. He gave his testimony of being persecuted verbally by the community, but encouraged his teachers not to listen to the negative voices and to continue in their bible

study and church attendance. This greatly inspired all those who attended the conference.
